

AT EL DORADO

Reports were current that J. A. Wilson had closed a deal with Oklahoma oil men for a lease on 80 acres of land one-fourth mile southeast of the Wilson well, in section 25-25-5. The consideration was said to have been between \$300 and \$400 per acre.

Drillers are still working at the Wilson well, section 27-25-5, but are making very slow time, as they are working through 2,600 feet of fluid.

Three shallow well completions were reported Tuesday—the Howe No. 3 and Moler No. 1 of the Wichita Natural, and the Hazlett No. 13.

The Bradford-Draper No. 4 has a smaller showing of oil than other wells nearby. They are planning to give it a 40-quart shot.

The Shaffer is drilling at 112 feet in the sand at 2,752 feet.

The Prairie is drilling at 2,700 feet; the Goble-Forrestal is trying to straighten up a crevice; the Snively is waiting for fuel; the Stokes in 33 shut down for engine repairs; Pippig casing with 8-inch at 1,675; Howe deep test spudding; Boyer drilling at 470; Chesney drilling at 160; Hayman drilling at 975; Adsit drilling at 850.
