ARMAND CO. LOSES \$54,000 NOTE SUIT

Sunshine Fights Action as Signer With Gardos.

After nearly two days' consideration, a jury in the court of Judge Frederick P. Walther late Wednesday afternoon rendered a judgment of \$54,065.01 in favor of the Beckenbach Company, 3503 St. Clair ave., against the Armand Drug and Candy Company, Armand A. Gardos and David Sunshine, of 2792 Fairmount blvd.

In 1821 the Armand company purchased the stock and equipment of the H-B Company for \$125,000. The sum of \$50,000 was paid in cash, and the remainder, \$75,000, was in the form of a note in favor of the Beckenbach Company. Prior to the action just completed the debt had been reduced to \$51,932.32 by the Armand company, and it was this sum, plus interest, that was awarded by the jury Wednesday.

Gardos, who left the country to escape federal charges of violating the liquor law, and Sunshine were the note indorsers, but Sunshine alone fought the action of the Beckenbach

Company.
