River Dredging.

CLEVELAND, O., Oct. 18, 1889.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the board of improvements, No. 7 city hall, until 2 o'clock m., Saturday, Nov. 16, 1889, for dredging and removing bars and other obstructions from the Cuyahoga river, the old river bed and Sycamore street slip. Bids will be received for said work for a period of one year and for a period of five years, the city reserving the right to let the contract for either one or five years, as shall be deemed for the best interests of the city.

Plans and specifications may be seen and blank proposals can be obtained at the office of the city civil engineer, after Nov. 3, 1889.

Each proposal must contain the full name of the party or parties making the same and all persons interested therein and must be accompanied by a certified check of \$1,000.00, made payable to the city treasurer, as a guarantee that if the bid accepted a contract will be entered into, with bond of one-half the estimated amount of the contract.

No proposals will be entertained unless made on the blanks furnished by the engineer and delivered at the office of the board previous to 12 o'clock m., on the day specified.
