Friedrich Wilhelm Dannappel

Also known as William Denaple. He left Cleveland for California as part of "Howe's Train". William drove one wagon which capsized crossing the Pansack River. They arrived to Placerville on 4 Aug 1850. He is shown as a passenger on a steamer called Columbia which went from Port Oreford, Ore. to San Francisco arriving 27 Oct 1851.
