

On February 20, 1873, she was married to Mr. Paul E. Werner. To this union three sons were born. They are Edward Paul, born Sept. 2, 1875, now assistant superintendent of The Werner Company's plant; Frank Albert, born April 15, 1877, a graduate of the Institute of Technology of Boston, Mass., in the department of naval architecture, and marine engineering; now perfecting his studies in Berlin, Germany; and Richard Marvin, born May 22, 1878, an apprentice in the book-binding department of the Werner Company. With the exception of Frank A., all were present at her death.

Besides her immediate family and mother, Mrs. Werner leaves three brothers and one sister. They are, Charles B. Denaple, and John Denaple of Akron, Edward Denaple of Ransom, Ill., and Mrs. Mary Bahl of Akron.
