On this 3rd day of February A. D., one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace, within and for the County and State aforesaid,

Thomas Goodie aged 47 years, a resident of the Town of Littlefield in Herkimer County in the State of New York, who being duly sworn, according to law, declares that he is the identical Thomas Goodie who was a Carpenter in the Company commanded by Capt. Isaac Mills in the 1st Regiment of Artillery commanded by Col. C. P. Bellinger in the War with Great Britain, declared by the United States on the 18th day of June, 1812. That he was called into service under the General Orders of the Governor of this State, for its defence at Sackett Harbor and rendezvoused at Brooklyn on or about the 7th day of October 1814 from thence were marched to Sackett Harbor and continued in actual service in said War for the term of seven half months and was honorably discharged at Sackett Harbor and under further General Orders of the said Governor of this State, for its defence at Sackett Harbor and rendezvoused at Sackett Harbor on or about the 1st day of 181 from thence were marched to Sackett Harbor and continued in actual service in said War for the term of seven half months and was honorably discharged at Sackett Harbor

for which he has received from the United States his Land Warrant No. 5,660 not executed for forty acres, and that he has not received any additional pay for the said service, nor any portion of the sum directed to be paid him by the Act entitled "An act authorizing additional pay to be made," &c., passed by the Legislature of the State of New York, October 21st, 1814, a copy of which is hereunto annexed; and that there is now due and payable to him from the State of New York, the sum of seven 00 dollars, with interest thereon, agreeable to the said Law. And further, in the performance of the service before recited, he furnished at his own cost the following clothing and equipments, as directed by the "Act to organize the Militia of the State of New York," &c., passed March 29th, 1809, and the General Orders heretofore referred to:

Authorizing additional pay to be made to the Volunteers, and for paying the Militia called into service by the State Authority.

PASSED October 21st, 1814.

I.—Be it enacted by the People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, That the Governor shall cause to be paid to each non-commissioned officer, musician and private, of the Volunteer Corps, and the legal representatives of those who may be deceased, raised in pursuance of general orders of March thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, for the time they were in actual service, a sum, in addition to his pay from the United States, sufficient to make the monthly pay of a sergeant fifteen dollars, a corporal and musician fourteen dollars, and a private thirteen dollars; Provided, that no payment shall be made to any individual, or the legal representatives of any individual, who shall have deserted at any period of the term for which he volunteered his services.

II.—And be it further enacted, That the Governor shall cause to be paid to each officer, non-commissioned officer, musician and private, of the Militia who have been or may hereafter be called into the service by State authority, such sums as they would respectively be entitled to by law, if in the service of the United States.

III.—And be it further enacted, That the Comptroller shall draw his warrant on the treasury for such sums as the Governor may require, for the payment authorized by this act, for all which sums an account shall be rendered to the Comptroller, within six months after their payment.

Schomaker* in the war with Great Britain, declared by the United States on the 18th day of June, 1812. That he volunteered or was drafted under the General orders of the Governor of this State, for its defence at *Sackett Harbor* on or about the *4th* day of *October* A. D. 1814 for the term of *the war* and continued in actual service in said War, for the term of *six weeks* and was honorably discharged from said service on or about the *17th* day of *November* 1814, at *Sackett Harbor* for which he has received from the United States his Land Warrant, No. *46714* for *120* acres, and that he has not received any portion of the sum directed to be paid him by the Act entitled "An Act for the relief of certain Volunteers and Militia called into service for the defence of the frontiers of the State in the late War, and for other purposes," passed April 21st, 1818; and the Act of 9th April, 1819. Declarant further says that he lives in Lotfield at the time he was called in to serve at Sackett Harbor and State of New York and from there to Sackett Harbor where he was called is one hundred miles that it took him five days to go to said Harbor and five days to return from said Harbor when he was discharged to his home in Lotfield and he further says he has received two Land Warrants for 40 acres and 120 acres one of the 40 acres that are private. Declarant further says that the items charged for clothing are not the original cost as he has but an estimate as near as he can make of the loss by their wear and tear of said clothing whilst he was in the service as above stated.
