

LEON'S MILLINER ASKING DIVORCE; CHARGES THREAT

Alléging threats to kill, Lydia Heath, Leon, filed suit for divorce from G. S. Heath, in district court Saturday, through Attorneys Leland & Geddes.

Mrs. Heath's petition also charges extreme cruelty; that he has a high temper and a quarrelsome disposition. She alleges that on May 8, 1912, he told her that if she had any business to attend to that she had better do it as she only had a few more days to live; that he had a gun in the house and was going to kill both of them as there was nothing in life and they were getting old.

She charges that he has failed to provide for her and that she had to engage in business to support her and her children, paying the house rent and buying the household supplies. She asks the custody of her three children by a former husband and the restoration of her former name of Lydia Mulkey. She asks that her millinery stock in Leon be set aside and that he be barred from interest.
