Franklin Melvin ROBINSON

Frank enlisted twice in the Civil War. He first enrolled in Company B, 135th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He "enrolled" at Clarington, Pennsylvania on 1 August 1862 and served until May 1863 when he was mustered out. He moved with his family to M innesota. He enlisted in Company G, 7th Regiment, Minnesota Infantry Volunteers on 25 Jan 1864 and was mustered out on 16 August 1865. He "enrolled" this time at St. Paul, Minnesota. His pension records are on file. They say he died in Long Creek, Grant Co., OR.

Notes (con't)

His death is something of a mystery. In 1885 his wife and children were living in Kansas. There is no information to suggest how Frank ended up working in Oregon and dying there. I believe his body may have been eventually removed to his parents who by this time had moved to the Dakota Territory in what is today Emmons Co., North Dakota but do not know for certain. His CW Pension Application includes a letter from a Justice of the Peace who indicates Frank was a sheep camp tender who died Aug 31, 1895. He held an inquest and the body was buried in the Long Creek Cemetery. A reading of the records do not show Frank there but many are listed as unknown.

Mary Elizabeth CRAIG

Mary homesteaded land in North Dakota next to her in-laws in on 20 July, 1886. Perhaps she made this decision after Frank's death when she went to North Dakota with her children. She lived in North Dakota for several years and eventually was granted a patent by the US Government (Orig. filed on July 20, 1885). During this time she served as a teacher at the township school. After this she moved back to Wabaunsee County, Kansas for good.
