Our point is, to make the mos of, and turn to the best advantag that which at first appears to be great evil.

In conclusion we would say keep live stock and utilize th manure in the best and mos economical way. Sow clover and plow it under. Plow under al weeds and trash available. Giv the land good and thorough cul tivation, and no fear need be en tertained as to the future fertilit of our soil.
