William Alfred SHEPHERD

William Alfred Shepherd was born in 1860 in Highland County, Ohio. He as named for his grandfather who was a doctor there and likely assisted in his delivery. William's father Theo as a farmer and William began working on his father's farm at a young age. He met and married Emma Gorman in 1884 and they left for the cheap land available in Wabaunsee County, KS. He was soon followed by his parents and younger Charles. He farmed some rented land and began to build a life. He became something of an entrepreneur as he had a Sorghum Mill and made thousands of gallons of sorghum that he sold. He also became the local rep for the American Telephone Company as telephones began to appear and he installed them himself.

Tragedy struck the family in 1895 when Emma died from complications during the birth of thier 4th child Arthur (who also did not survive). William was a young widower with 3 young children. It was at the local church he met and later married a young woman named Claudia Daisy Robinson in 1897. The family continued to grow as Will and Daisy had 8 additional children.

In 1909 the family left for the cheap land and oportunities in St Clair County, MO. His daughter Bertha and her husband had left for the same location earlier and Will had been to visit several times. They stayed there until 1917 when they returned to Kansas and settled in El Dorado, Butler County, Kansas. Tragedy struck again as Claudia Daisy died of Spanish Influenza or "The Grippe" as it was known. Flu would become a pandemic and kill milliond in the 2 following years. The family reamined in El Dorado as William became a merchant. As he grew older he began to travel and visit his far flung children. He died in 1934 while visiting a daughter in Tacoma, Washington.

Claudia Daisy ROBINSON

Claudia Daisy Robinson (most often known as Daisy) was born in Osage County, Kansas. When she was oung the family moved to Wabaunsee County. Her father died while she was in her early teens and her mother took them for a few years to stay in Emmons County, North Dakota where her father's parents lived. After several years she and her family returned to Wbaunsee County where her mother's family still resided.

She became a school teacher in the early 1890s which was important income in support of her mothers and siblings until her mother was granted a Civil War pension. It was during these years she met widower William A. Shepherd who had 3 young children. In 1897 they were married. Will and Daisy had 8 children (2 of which died as infants) The family spent time in Missouri from 1909 until 1917 when they moved back to Kansas and settled in El Dorado the county seat of Butler County. Daisy died of Influenza in December of 1917.
