## THE ORIGIN OF THE CAROLINGIANS

Of late years there seems to be a revival of interest in Charlemagne. In 1935 Prof. Dr. Eric Brandenburg printed at Leipsic his "Die Nachkommen Karls des Grossen", a careful and critical compilation of the descendants of the emperor for fourteen generations or roughly down to about the year 1200. In 1942 Dr. Marcellus D. R. von Redlich of Chicago issued the first volume of "Pedigrees of Some of the Emperor Charlemagne's Descendants". which was the first attempt in America to compile a carefully checked series of present day descents from him.

The descendants of Charlemagne today are numbered in the millions and they are to be found in every country of Europe and the United States; for among the early settlers of this country there was a considerable number whose descent from Charlemagne can be fully
